


STRATEGIC OVERVIEW

I. Mission Statement

To reinforce the position of Mauritius as a competitive and reputable International Financial Centre anchored on principles of Good Governance, a robust Anti-Money Laundering and Combating the Financing of Terrorism and Proliferation Framework as well as global best practices

II. Current Situation & Challenges

- The financial services sector contributed 14 percent to the Gross Value Added in 2023.
- Employment in large establishments operating in the financial services sector, including insurance and banks, increased to 15,298 in 2023 compared to 14,740 in 2022.
- The growth rate of the financial services sector increased to 4.3 percent in 2023 compared to 4.2 percent in 2022.

- Mauritius is positioning itself as the ideal platform for investment into Africa. Being a member of the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA), Mauritius has the necessary leverage to route impactful investment into mainland Africa.
- Several Memoranda of Understanding have been signed to foster bilateral cooperation, for example, between Mauritius Financial Services Commission (FSC) and India (International Financial Services Centres Authority) to promote the development and regulation of financial products, services and institutions.
- Mauritius is in the process of negotiating various bilateral agreements covering, *inter-alia*, the financial services sector with countries, such as the United Arab Emirates, Saudi Arabia, Seychelles, Bangladesh, China, Rwanda and Nepal.
- Mauritius has a robust legal and institutional framework to combat money laundering and the financing of terrorism and proliferation, positioning itself in the top-tier jurisdictions which are compliant or largely compliant to all the 40 Financial Action Task Force's (FATF) Recommendations.
- Mauritius is undertaking a thorough mid-term independent assessment of its present Anti-Money Laundering and Combating the Financing of Terrorism and Proliferation (AML/CFT/CPF) Framework, for the purpose of identifying any deficiencies and implementing corrective measures ahead of the next Mutual Evaluation exercise.

- In May 2024, Mauritius has, in collaboration with Eastern and Southern Africa Anti-Money Laundering Group (ESAAMLG), organised an in-country FATF Assessors Training with the objective of expanding the pool of regional AML/CFT/CPF experts to enhance the effectiveness of the AML/CFT/CPF regimes in the region in view of the next round of Mutual Evaluations.
- The Office of Public Sector Governance (OPSG) completed 9 financial and organisational reviews in Public Sector Organisations from July 2023 to March 2024.

Key Challenges

- Greater competition from existing and new International Financial Centres (IFC)
- Ensure a seamless access to a pool of skilled manpower to help sustain the growth of the financial services sector
- Attract start-ups as well as developing innovative products and services in the field of FinTech and sustainable finance and investment
- Align with the evolving changes in the FATF standards as well as keeping abreast with emerging Money Laundering/Terrorism Financing/Proliferation Financing risks
- Ensure the continuous application of good governance practices in the public sector
- Include the enhancement of the independence and effectiveness of Audit Committees
