VOTE 1-4 NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

CONTEXT FOR BUDGET INTERVENTION

The Parliament of Mauritius is modelled after the Westminster system of parliamentary democracy comprising the National Assembly. Members of the National Assembly are voted in at regular general elections.

The National Assembly is made up of 70 Members of whom 62 are directly elected in 21 constituencies on the basis of a first past the post system. The island of Mauritius is divided into 20 constituencies returning 3 members each and that of Rodrigues is a single constituency returning 2 members. After a general election, the Electoral Supervisory Commission may nominate up to a maximum of 8 additional members in accordance with section 5 of the First Schedule of the Constitution with a view to correcting any imbalance in community representation in Parliament. This system of nominating members is commonly called the best loser system.

The political party or party alliance which wins the majority of seats in the National Assembly forms the government and its leader usually becomes the Prime Minister. It is the Prime Minister who selects the members of the Cabinet from elected members of the Assembly, except for the Attorney General who may not be an elected member of the Assembly. The political party or alliance, which has the second largest majority forms the Official Opposition and its leader is normally nominated by the President of the Republic as the Leader of the Opposition. The Assembly elects a Speaker, a Deputy Speaker and a Deputy Chairman of Committees as one of its first business.
