Structured meetings with relevant stakeholders (Commissioner of Police and Commissioner of Prisons) will be held in order to propose a mechanism for the implementation of the recommendations.

Programme 141: Protection and Promotion of Human Rights.

- Structured meetings with relevant stakeholders (Police, Prisons etc.) with a view to ensure efficient and timely processing of complaints.

Structured meetings as compared to sensitisation campaigns, have the advantage of being less costly than sensitisation campaigns as it provides a forum where relevant stakeholders and the Commission can interchange views and decide on appropriate corrective measures to prevent the recurrence of certain problems.
