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PART A: OVERVIEW OF MINISTRY/DEPARTMENT

I. STRATEGIC NOTE

1. Major Achievements for 2012

- Outreach programme: In order to market furniture and chattels manufactured in Prison Industries, two expo-sales have been held for the intention of a select public comprising of Government and Non-Government Prison stakeholders.
- 62% of success of male detainees at the level of CPE.
- 70% of success of male detainees in Internet and Computing Core Certification (IC3).
- 100% of success of male detainees in MITD Welding and Metal Fabrication Course (National Trade Certificate Level 3 (NTC3).
- 100% of success of female detainees in MITD Garment Making Course NTC3.
- 100% of male and 83% of female detainees passed in Fibre Craft and Handy Craft.
- 100% of success for female detainees in MITD Basic Pastry Course.
- 175 drug dependent detainees initiated on Methadone Substitute Therapy.

2. Major Constraints and Challenges and how they are being addressed

- Limited capacity in Prisons.
 - Completion of Construction of Prison at Melrose under Construction by mid-July 2013.
 - Launching of tender and start of construction of Open Women Prison in 2013 which is expected to be completed by 2014.
- High prevalence of illicit drug dependent detainees.
 - Induction on Methadone Substitution Therapy.
- Under use of Parole: during the past six years, an average of 1.4 % of detainees have benefited from Parole.
 - Reviewing of the concept of Parole.
 - Reconstitution of the Parole Board.
- Illicit trafficking through mobile phones.
 - Upgrading of jammer to block 3G and WIFI signals at BBP.
 - Introduction of fixed jammer at PVP and Grand River North West Remand Prison and movable jammer for other Prisons for combating illicit drug trafficking through mobile phones.
 - introduction of mobile phones signal detectors.
- Earning Capacity of detainees for sustenance during the first month of release.
 - Resorting to Enhanced Earning Scheme to increase the Earnings on productive jobs with increase in saving capacity.

3. Strategic Direction 2013-2015

The Mauritius Prison Service will improve its services to ensure compliance with Human Rights and international norms. The main strategies are to:

- Improve security of prisons.
- Increase the range of skill development for easy employability on release.
- Introduction of new Rehabilitation Program such as Good Lives Model and Risk Needs Responsivity Model.
- Improve capacity building for staff.
- Reduce overcapacity.
- Establish a Strategic Planning and Research Capability.

Conducive Prison environment for safe and secure containment.

Major Services:

- Policy formulation and implementation.
- Prisons management.

Programme 292: Custody and Rehabilitation of Detainees

Priority Objectives:

• Exploring new vistas of skills development for better reintegration of detainees on release.

Major Services:

- Provision of educational and vocational training.
- Provision of physical and mental health care.
- Provision of (a) Residential Therapeutic Programs, (b) Day-Care Outreach Program and (c) Methadone Substitution Therapy to illicit drug dependent detainees.
