Mission Statement

To serve society by keeping detainees in safe, humane custody and help prepare them for a useful life.

Strategic Direction 2016-2019

- Engage detainees in activities that will help address their offending behaviour and prepare them to become law-abiding citizens.
- Reduce reoffending by introducing best correctional practice and the setting up of a detoxification and rehabilitation programme within the prison set-up.

Main Achievements for FY 2015/16

- Operationalisation of an Open Prison for Women which can accommodate up to twenty women detainees.
- A Correctional Youth Centre for girls operational as from April 2016.
- Introduction of the "Pay Back Mauritius" scheme whereby detainees are engaged in projects that help maintain community assets and services. Major projects include the upliftment of La Prairie Public Beach, production of compost from green waste at Petit Verger Prison, tree planting at La Citadelle and from Wooton roundabout to Providence roundabout.
- An Internal Inspectorate Mechanism set up to inspect prison institutions and actively address complaints from detainees.
- Some 160 detainees have followed accredited educational and vocational programmes.
