MINISTRY OF FISHERIES

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PART A: STRATEGIC NOTE OF MINISTRY

I. Major Achievements for 2013

- Export of fish and fish products increased by 33.6% to attain Rs12.7 billion representing 18.7% of national exports.
- The Competent Authority Seafood was granted autonomy in terms of financial accountability for increased efficiency to monitor and ensure international requirements for safety and quality of fish and fish products intended for export.
- Regulations for import and export of fish and fish products were promulgated to streamline and facilitate trade.
- Regulations made for reducing the annual sea concession fee for inland and marine based aquaculture from Rs1.2 million to Rs 100,000 per site.
- 12 new aquaculture sites with their respective World Geodetic System (WGS) 84 coordinates were finalised for proclamation.
- 8 aquaculture floating cages (2 at Poste de Flacq, 4 at Quatre Soeurs, 1 at Grand Gaube and 1 at Trou d'Eau Douce) were set at sea for the fishermen community.
- 1,000,000 fingerlings of "cordonnier" were released around the island to ensure continued lagoon replenishment. 400,000 fingerlings of sea bream produced at hatchery level for release.
- An MOU was signed between the Ministry of Fisheries and the General Administration of Quality Supervision, Inspection and Quarantine of the People's Republic of China to further improve safety of fish and fish products to be exported to China.
- To deter illegal fishing in the lagoon, 636 contraventions were established, 17,679 metres of nets seized and a total fine of Rs 697,400 inflicted for cases prosecuted.
- Regional fisheries surveillance including patrolling of EEZs is being undertaken as from October 2013 by IOC member countries.
- Based on an ecosystem approach to fisheries and in order to sustainably manage the fishery resources of the banks, a Bank Fishery Management Plan for shallow water demersal fish of the Saya de Malha and the Nazareth Banks was developed for implementation.

II. Major Constraints and Challenges and how they are being addressed

- Market constraints for expanding exports of fish and fish products.
 - Establish bilateral cooperation to accede to new markets and expand trade opportunities for fish processing and export.
- Risks associated with long term availability of raw tuna fish for processing.

- Diversify and explore potential market access with opportunities for cumulating originating status of processed fish and negotiations with the European Union on relaxing rules of origin.
- Attract foreign direct investment of Rs 1.3 billion in purse seiners operating under the Mauritian flag and in fish processing plants in coming three years.
- Opportunities for transhipment activities in the Port.
 - Address the issue of restriction of sale by-catch.
- Conservation and bio-diversity threats.
 - Improving data collection and information for better management and resilience.
 - Coral farming for reef rehabilitation.
 - Lagoon replenishment.

III. Strategic Direction 2014-2016

- Encourage operators in seafood to drive exports in new market niches namely sashimi production.
- Ensure sustainability of fisheries resources through an ecosystem approach to fisheries management.
- Increase aquaculture production.

- Development of national fleet capacity to harness the resources of the EEZ and the high seas.
- Capacity building and training of fishermen and other stakeholders.

- Development of Fisheries Management Plans for the Lagoon and Off-lagoon.
- Accreditation of laboratories for monitoring of seawater quality and screening of toxic marine microalgae and potentially toxic fish
