MINISTRY OF HOUSING AND LANDS

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PART A: STRATEGIC NOTE OF MINISTRY

I. Major Achievements for 2013

Housing

- Construction of 36 housing units at Military Road, Port Louis completed.
- Tender for construction of 70 housing units of 41m² and provision of 48 serviced plots over an extent of 10A 10P at Henrietta has been launched.
- Contract for global consultancy services awarded for the design and supervision of the construction of 334 Housing Units (39m²) & associated infrastructure works on undeveloped plots of State Land within 23 existing NHDC Housing Estates.
- Contract for consultancy services awarded for the following 3 projects:-
 - Construction of 588 housing units and provision of 151 serviced plots on 6 sites (Batch I) namely at Chebel, Pointe aux Piments, Camp Ithier, Quatre Cocos, Sebastopol and Beau Bois.
 - Construction of 301 housing units and provision of 244 serviced plots on 6 sites (Batch II) namely at Melrose, Mon Gout, Petit Bel Air, Souillac, Surinam, and Khoyratty.
 - Construction of 172 housing units and provision of 37 serviced plots on 4 sites (available plots of State Land) namely at Camp de Masque, La Gaulette, Pointe aux Sables and Mare D'Albert.
- Allocation of serviced lots to 63 eligible beneficiaries, namely at Bambous, Bel Etang, Piton and St Pierre.
- Contract for rehabilitation works awarded in respect of rehabilitation of water reticulation network on 11 NHDC Housing Estates, remedial works to wastewater disposal system on 37 NHDC Housing Estates, and waterproofing and associated works on NHDC Housing Estates.
- 1,352 households obtained financial grant under the Casting of Roof Slabs Grant Scheme as at August 2013. As from July 2013, applicants for such financial assistance are screened through the Social Register of Mauritius (SRM) framework.
- 41 Syndics set up in NHDC Housing Estates benefitted from government grant to maintain common spaces.
- Sale of plots of State Land on which stand ex-CHA Houses Some additional 1,000 owners of ex-CHA housing units have been provided with financial assistance in terms of legal and other charges as well as waiving off of price of land.
- Consultant has been appointed for the design and supervision of the construction of onsite/offsite infrastructure works on three sites, namely at Bambous, Camp Levieux and Coteau Raffin.

Land Use Planning

- New draft Outline Planning Schemes for the five municipal council areas prepared to be used for better development control and guidance.
- Participatory Slum Upgrading Program (PSUP) reports on Phase II prepared to address slum upgrading and prevention strategy.
- Planning Policy Guidance (PPG) has been updated to provide a set of design tools for development control purposes.
- The PPG for Sloping sites has been amended with the assistance of Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) to include landslide and flooding issues.
- Training was provided to improve capacity and skills on interpretation of Outline Scheme policies
 and Planning Policy Guidance to councilors and local planners, on the need for sound land use
 planning.
- 279 morcellement permits have been issued as at 31 October 2013.

Land Management

- 862 lease agreements drawn up as at 31 October 2013.
- 10,222 Parcel Identification Numbers (PINs) have been issued for period ending October 2013.
- 119.40 ha (282A86P) of land has been acquired for implementation of government projects.
- The Land Acquisition Act has been amended to provide interim payment of compensation pending award of the Board of Assessment.
- Regulations have been made under the Cadastral Survey Act 2011 to make the use of PINs mandatory in Mauritius as from July 2013.
- Regulations have been made under the Cadastral Survey Act 2011 for the standardization of land survey practices in Mauritius and Rodrigues with a view to regularizing the Land Survey Practices by ensuring more accuracy and professionalism.
- LAVIMS Network of 25 tertiary geodetic control points has been established.
- Hydrography Hydrographic surveys completed for Poudre d'Or and Grand River South East offcoast regions.

II. Major Constraints and Challenges and how they are being addressed

Housing

- Delay in obtaining land under the Government/ MSPA Agreement.
 - Close monitoring through regular meetings and site visits with sugar estates representatives and also through the Steering Committee set up for the release of MSPA land for agricultural and social purposes.
- Delay in obtaining approval for projects through the statutory project assessment and screening process.
 - Regular meetings are held with concerned parties to clarify and expedite matters.
- Non cooperation and lack of participation of NHDC residents in the smooth implementation of rehabilitation works on NHDC Housing Estates.
 - To carry out sensitization campaign to change mindset of NHDC inhabitants to encourage them to cooperate with their respective Syndic and other stakeholders for improving the living conditions of the residents of the Housing Estates.

Land Use Planning

- Need for an updated and regularly reviewed sustainable planning framework to ensure development occurs in a planned and orderly manner
 - Strengthening of the Planning Division through enlistment of additional Planners and new skills.
 - Training sessions for Planners at central and local government and other stakeholders of land matters. The formal training course at University level will be reviewed with authorities concerned.
 - Training in up to date Geographical Information System (GIS) technology and use of GIS equipment.

Land Management

- Procedures for land acquisition lengthy and cumbersome.
 - Use of LAVIMS to identify owners whose lands have to be acquired.
 - Ongoing monitoring committees, led by the Ministry of Housing and Lands, with line Ministries where major infrastructural projects are being undertaken.
- Delay in the processing of application for leases.
 - Processes for grant of lease enhanced through a computerized State land register and lease administration system.
- Lack of staff for timely delivery of PINs.
 - Capability enhancement.

III. Strategic Direction 2014-2016

Housing

- Promote social integration through the development of mixed housing projects under the National
 Housing Programme and adopt an integrated approach that is applied to the construction of a small
 number of housing units in an open estate to encourage community living, integration within the
 neighbourhoods and harmony with the environment.
- Ensure a good living housing condition through the implementation of rehabilitation works and maintenance of NHDC Housing Estates by the Syndics.
- Promote home ownership through the National Housing Programme and the Roof Slab Grant Scheme.
- Improve access to affordable housing for the middle income households.

Land Use Planning

- Create conducive conditions for business and other investments through efficient and timely spatial planning.
- Optimize land use through innovative planning practices.

Land Management

- Create a State Land Digital Register for better management of State lands.
- Enhance LAVIMS to allow instant updating of transactions.
- Reduce land acquisition processing time through the use of Digital Cadastral Databases.
- Update spatial data repository and data sharing.

IV. Priority objectives and major services to be provided for 2014-2016

Programme 641: Policy and Management for Housing and Lands

Priority Objective:

• Provide a more efficient service in terms of land use planning and management and provision of housing to targeted population.

Major Services:

- Formulation of policies and guidelines for a more effective and efficient delivery of services.
- Provision of legal, institutional and regulatory framework for land use planning and land management to meet development goals.

Programme 642: Social Housing Development

Priority Objective:

Provide 10,000 housing units for low income groups and 5,000 serviced lots for lower middle income families during the next 10 years.

Major Services:

- Allocation of housing units to low income families and serviced plots of land to the lower middle income families.
- Infrastructure provision for sites identified for the relocation of squatters.
- Grant for casting of roof slab to low income families to complete the construction of their housing unit for income threshold validated through the Social Register of Mauritius (SRM).
- Rehabilitation of existing utilities infrastructures on NHDC Housing Estates.
- Sale of plots of State Land to owners of ex-CHA housing units.
- Assistance to owners of ex- CHA housing units who are facing difficulties in acquiring their plot of land.
- Financial assistance to Syndics in the management of their respective Housing Estates.

Programme 643: Land Management and Physical Planning

Sub-programme 64301: Land Use Planning

Priority Objective:

• Ensure that development is undertaken in a planned and sustainable manner.

Major Services:

- Review and preparation of Planning Policy Guidance, Outline Planning Schemes, Planning Policy Guidelines and National Land Development Strategy.
- Issue of planning clearances in respect of major development projects on State lands.
- Issue of morcellement permits.
- Address planning issues with respect to claims for compensation as a result of acquisition or further to planning decisions.
- Coordinate the National Habitat Committee in view of United Nations Habitat III Committee in 2016.
- Follow-up on PSUP Phase II.
 - Facilitate the provision of serviced areas for development purposes by adopting an integrated approach to spatial planning and seeking private sector collaboration through equity in land or funding.
 - Review planning legislation to support delivery of planning services.

Sub-Programme 64302: Land Management

Priority Objective:

• Ensure sustainable land management for balanced socio-economic development.

Major Services:

- Proper administration and lease of State lands through putting in place a State Land Register.
- Timely acquisition of private lands for Government projects and payment of compensation.
- Issue of PINs for land transactions.
- Provision of detailed geodetic control points for cadastral surveys.
- Conduct of hydrographic surveys in our waters.

- Sale of navigational charts.
- Provide up-to-date topographic, thematic and aerial imagery and maps.
