

## STRATEGIC OVERVIEW

### I. Mission Statement

To boost the digital economy, promote the use of information technology in delivery of public services and become a competitive and innovation-driven nation.

### II. Current Situation & Challenges

- The Information, Communication and Technology (ICT) sector grew by 3.9 percent in 2020, indicating resilience of the sector to the pandemic.



- In 2019, some 16,200 persons were employed in large establishments (employing 10 or more persons) operating in the ICT sector.
- Out of 193 countries, Mauritius ranked 63<sup>rd</sup> in the 2020 E-Government Development Index compared to 66<sup>th</sup> in 2018.
- The country gained 30 places in the Global Innovation Index Report 2020, leapfrogging to 52<sup>nd</sup> position from 82<sup>nd</sup> in 2019.
- The digitalisation of services has been accelerated over the last years. So far, over 130 Government services are accessible online. Recent initiatives include:
  - ‘Maupass’, which is a single sign on service, to validate the digital identity of citizens who are transacting with Government online;
  - ‘Mo Rendez Vous’ app, which is an electronic Queue Management System to manage queues and reduce waiting times; and
  - Government has also invested in infrastructure for the issue of digital certificates.
- The Mauritius Research and Innovation Council, which operates a number of research and innovation schemes, has financed 92 projects and 36 start-ups supported by the five accredited Incubators in FY 2020/21.

### Key Challenges

- Differing rates of technology adoption and administrative bottlenecks hinder the deployment of seamless government e-services.
- A new advanced skill sets is required to understand emerging technologies, their limitations and applications.
- Higher risk of cybersecurity attacks that require the strengthening of regulatory frameworks and increased awareness on the importance of a secured cyber space.
